

Message from the Railroad

The Santa Maria Valley Railroad wrapped up one of its busiest years in 2012 in 20 years. We have experienced increased freight traffic from many of our customers as we are operating 6 days a week and sometimes 7 days a week. When trains are not operating MOW crews have been working on track replacing ties and rail and signal crews cleaning and servicing signal equipment.

The downside of all of this business is the increase in rail traffic. The railroad is simply too busy to host special events such as speeder excursions and Friends programs. Since we are no longer able to host these events, there are fewer opportunities for Friends fundraisers. In order to fund the newsletters and Friends programs and tours for 2013, the railroad is sponsoring the production of the newsletters and sponsoring the Friends programs and tours. We hope this will continue to enhance the value of your Friends membership.

The railroad will also continue to donate historical items and documents to the Friends. Some of these items will be loaned to the San Luis Railroad Museum for rotating displays.

Ray was a visionary who always felt that the Santa Maria Valley holds great economic potential and the railroad was a part of that plan to bring economic prosperity to the Santa Maria Valley. Ray spoke at one of our first programs in 2007 about his vision for downtown Santa Maria and Jones Street.



Hal Madson passed away

Since our last newsletter, Friends lost one of its founding members, Hal Madson. Known to many of you, Hal was a valued railroad historian for our valley. He was most well known for his two books about the area: Railroads of the Santa Maria Valley, and Betteravia, a Modern California Ghost Town.





Hal was the SMVRR company historian and had served as an advisory director of the Santa Maria Valley Railroad. Hal was a founding member of the Friends of the Santa Maria Valley Railroad and served as its president the first year. Hal assisted the current company with the purchase of the Santa Maria Valley Railroad in 2006. Hal was a walking encyclopedia on the history of the Santa Maria Valley Railroad, yet he was always looking at the future of the railroad.

Hal was a very valuable advisor to the railroad, excellent friend to Friends, and a great guy who will be greatly missed.
